


NR 190 LAKE PLANNING GRANTS

PROVIDE INFORMATION AND EDUCATION ABOUT LAKES AND THEIR NATURAL ECOSYSTEMS, AND DEVELOP PLANS FOR THEIR PROTECTION

- 67% State Share
- Small Scale \$3,000
- Large Scale \$25,000
- \$100,000 lifetime cap

Assessments & Plans:

- Water Quality
- Aquatic life & habitat
- Watersheds






NR 191 LAKE PROTECTION IMPLEMENT PROJECTS THAT WILL PROTECT OR RESTORE LAKES AND THEIR ECOSYSTEMS

- 75% state share
- Up to \$200,000 per grant (some projects are less) No lifetime cap
- Land Acquisition
- Wetland & Shoreland Restoration
- Local Ordinance Development
- County Lake Classification
- Activities in an Approved Plan






NR 191.30 LAKE CLASSIFICATION

Per-grant Max of \$50,000; requires 25% match
Only counties are eligible
Funds data collection and analysis using GIS
and mapping to place waters into classes. Types
of data may include:


- lake size, depth, shape, and water quality
- watershed size, potential runoff sources, land uses and development patterns
- recreational uses, fish and wildlife habitat, etc.



NR 191.30 LAKE CLASSIFICATION

Beyond data collection and analysis, Lake Classification funding can be used for:

- Objective setting for a classification system
- Investigation and selection of appropriate classification criteria
- Investigation and assignment of appropriate protection and management tools for different classes of lakes



NR 191.30 LAKE CLASSIFICATION

Protection and implementation funding can be used for:

- Adoption of policies which encourage management of waters based on the specific needs of each water body
- Implementation of alternative management tools: purchase of easements, development of individual lake management plan






